TRANSLATIONS OF TEXTS

Sicut cervus

Like as the hart desireth the water brooks, so longeth my soul after thee, O Lord. (Psalm 42: 1)

Tristis est anima mea

My soul is sorrowful unto death; stay here and watch with me. Soon you will see the crowd surround me, you will take flight, and I will go to be sacrificed for you. (Matthew 26: 37-38, 51, 56)

Gott, sei mir gnädig nach deiner Güte

- 1. (Chorus) God, have mercy on me, according to thy lovingkindness: according unto the multitude of thy tender mercies blot out my transgressions.
- 2. (Alto) Wash me throughly from mine iniquity: and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3. (Alto) For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me.
- 4. (Soprano, Chorus) Against thee, thee only, have I sinned, and done this evil in thy sight: that thou mightiest be justified when thou speakest, and be clear when thou judgest.
- 5. (Tenor) Behold, I was shapen in iniquity: and in sin did my mother conceive me. (Bass) Behold, thou desireth truth in the inward parts: and in the hidden part thou shalt make me to know wisdom. (Chorus) Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 6. (Soprano, Tenor, Chorus) Make me to hear joy and gladness: that the bones may rejoice which thou hast broken. (Psalm 51: 1-8)
